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The goal of the RaT curriculum is to develop the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to provide high quality educational experiences to medical students and fellow residents, both in the clinical and non-clinical realms. The objectives of the curriculum can be subdivided into 4 categories:

COMMUNICATOR/COLLABORATOR

1. Preparing/delivering effective presentations
 - a. Understand the importance of delivering effective presentations
 - b. Know the aspects that distinguish effective and ineffective presentations
 - c. Demonstrate effective presentation skills to a large audience
2. Giving verbal feedback
 - a. Appreciate the need to create a safe and positive learning environment
 - b. Understand what makes feedback effective and ineffective
 - c. Demonstrate use of a standardized framework for delivering effective feedback
 - d. Knows different frameworks for difficult conversations such as advocacy-inquiry

3. Teaching on the fly/bedside
 - a. Appreciate the need to create a safe and positive learning environment
 - b. Using an evidence based frame work such as One Minute Preceptor, demonstrates effective bedside teaching in a timely manner
4. Managing learners and learner in difficulty
 - a. Appreciate the need to create a safe and positive learning environment
 - b. Understand the need to be an effective manager of large groups of learners using strategies such as delegation
 - c. Creates effective learning plans
 - d. Develops a framework for diagnosing the learner in difficulty
